Jeannie Alexander is the prison chaplain at Riverbend Maximum Security Institution (a men's maximum security prison that houses Tennessee's death row inmates) and a co-founder of a Catholic Worker community in Nashville. She was a homeless outreach worker for six years. She is a frequent speaker at conferences, churches, colleges, and seminaries on a multitude of topics including "Consistent Pro-Life Ethic from Womb to Tomb" and "Poverty and the American Prison System". She also teaches Religion and Ethics at Nashville State Community College, and has taught Just Faith at a local parish. Jeannie holds an undergraduate degree in Philosophy, a Masters in Religious Studies with a focus on Christian Ethics, and a Juris Doctorate from Cornell.
