Dear Friends of Life,

I am so excited to write to you today as we begin a new year in our shared mission to protect life at every age and any stage. For those of you I have not had a chance to connect with yet, let me start by saying how honored I am by the opportunity to help lead this incredible organization with such a passionate and professional staff devoted to serving the most vulnerable among us each and every day. I am most grateful to those who have grown this organization from its humble beginnings, chief among them, Karen Garnett, our honorary Executive Director Emeritus.

The foundation of the CPLC has given us the fortitude to help steer remarkable advancements for the Cause of Life here in North Texas and beyond. We expect this year to be no different. While we face new challenges with the anticipated reopening of a third abortion facility in Dallas, we also have new opportunities with state and federal leaders who profess to share our pro-life commitment. We plan to hold them to their promises and challenge them to defend life from conception until natural death.

We began the effort this month as we marched together in downtown Dallas and Washington, D.C. But this was just the first step. The next step is making our voices heard throughout the legislative session. We are committed to keeping you updated with the most current information and means to connect with your legislators when critical issues are being debated – like the "No Taxpayer Funding for Abortion Act" being considered by Congress.

In addition to keeping our eyes on D.C., we will also be headed to Austin on April 4 for the bi-annual Catholic Faith in Action Advocacy Day. If you have not had a chance to be a part of this important event, I encourage you to visit cathdal.org/advocacyday to learn more. And whether you are a seasoned participant or new to Advocacy Day, we welcome everyone to the training on February 11 at St. Michael in Garland at 12:30 p.m. We expect this legislative session will present several critical opportunities to advance protections for life and family, including a ban on research on aborted fetal tissue, defunding abortion providers while funding alternative health resources, and increased reporting on abortions to help demonstrate what we already know - women deserve better than abortion. We will also advocate for much-needed conscience protections and for reform of the foster care system to encourage the loving option of adoption.

While there is a great deal of work ahead, there is also reason to celebrate! On April 1, 2017, we will welcome our new shepherd, Bishop Edward Burns, at our 24th Annual Bishop's Pro-Life Dinner. 

In her words

Project Gabriel Mom shares her "GEMS Journey"

Project Gabriel helped me when I was at my lowest. They gave me two wonderful angels that became part of my family. Joining the program changed my life because they helped me deal with my pregnancy; they gave me hope. The ladies there taught me how to stay optimistic and stop beating myself up, how to forgive myself, and how to deepen my faith.

I was born Catholic just like my mother and grandparents. It had been six months since I had gone to church. When I became pregnant, I didn't know what to do or where to go. My mother had agreed to help me, but I didn't have a clue what to do. My father finally forced me to have an abortion. I think it wasn't a coincidence that I chose the one next to the Project Gabriel office where I met Ingrid.



I was all alone in my apartment; my father had deserted me, and my mother was in the Congo. At that moment, God became my best friend. I would talk to Him every day, and He would answer in his own way. For example, I would wake up some days not knowing if I would have a decent meal. God never gave up on me.

Going to GEMS classes and listening about how God loves me and my baby was the highlight of my life. It gave me hope that, by keeping my baby, I was doing the right thing. One of the classes that really touched me was the one about forgiveness. In Matthew 6:14 it is written "For if you forgive men when they sin against you, your heavenly father will also forgive you."

The priest that came that day showed us that forgiving people and ourselves is for our own good. You have to forgive people in order to free yourself. I also learned to forgive myself and move on. I cannot start a new chapter in my life if I am stuck on what I did in the past. I should learn from my past mistakes.

We also talked about self-respect. Making a mistake does not define who I am and does not give other people the right to humiliate me or walk all over me. God loves everybody especially the ones who redeem themselves. I know he forgave me and that he loves me.

On October 20, 2015, I gave birth to a healthy baby boy I named Gabriel. I named him like the angel because he is my little angel, the blessing that came out of all these hard times. I got to spend three amazing months taking care of him before he went to live in the Congo with my mother and grandparents while I finish school. That baby is my whole world; there is nothing that I wouldn't do for him.

Sometimes I just want to give everything up, pack up my bags and go back home, but then my mother reminds me of Gabriel. I want to finish school as fast as I can so that Gabriel can finally live with me. I am missing so much right now, like his first words, first steps or even his first birthday. I miss him so much, and I cannot wait to have him with me again. Everything that I do, every hardship that I endure is for my little man. I will forever be thankful to Project Gabriel. Through the program, I am working very hard in order to have a steady job and bring Gabriel here with me.

The next morning was a brisk one, but the rain stayed away as pray-ers stood vigil outside abortion facilities and marchers filled Dallas City Hall Plaza (Praise God!). The spirited dancing of the Matachines was the gathering call followed by the beautiful Procession of Roses with forty-four children, teens and adults. Then thousands took to the downtown streets to the Earle Cabell Federal Courthouse for a rally of great music, inspirational speeches and a final solemn prayer as the roses were laid at the courthouse.
