SUMMARY OF POSITION

The Education Director assists in strategically planning and implementing education-related initiatives of the CPLC, manages conferences sponsored by the CPLC in collaboration with the Multicultural Department, and ensures all information presented is accurate and in keeping with the teachings of the Catholic Church.

- Managing the operations and staff employed in CPLC's Speakers Bureau and Youth For Life programs;
- Strategic planning for growth and development of the Education Ministry in collaboration with the Executive Director;
- Researching, developing, and updating presentations on chastity and life-issue related topics, and presenting on those topics to adults and youth;
- Developing, planning and executing regional conferences in collaboration with other ministry staff and partners, including biannual Do No Harm Series and Teach4Life seminar;
- Providing trainings for volunteer speakers and youth leaders, and assisting other ministries in training their volunteers as needed;
- Management of ministry budget;
- Representing the Education Ministry at both national and international conferences;
